ORDER

Perused the complaint. The complaint has been received through LokpalOnline portal but the signed physical copy of the complaint along with other supporting documents has not been received yet.

The complaint has been perused by the Full Bench of Lokpal for consideration of the Scrutiny Report and pass appropriate order.

It is noted that the complainant has not filled S.No.5 and 6 of Part-C of the complaint form. In column 5 of Part-C, the complainant had to furnish the summary of facts/allegations of corruption, which has been left blank. In S.No.6, the complainant had to furnish the particulars/list of the documents relied upon by the complainant in support of the allegations. This column has also been left blank by

the complainant. Also, the complaint form and notarized affidavit are unsigned. The complainant has mentioned the designation of the public servant in the relevant column in Part -C of complaint form against whom complaint has been made and not his name. We deem it appropriate to condone the remarks made by the office in the Scrutiny Report and entertain the complaint.

In support of documents/evidence, he has enclosed a statement of his bank account and another acknowledgement receipt which seems to be a complaint filed with the local police regarding some Demat/Depository fraud relating to trading in shares. These documents provide insufficient information relating to any corruption by any public servant. Further, the public servant mentioned in the complaint is a State Govt. official.

In view of the facts as mentioned above, the Full Bench do not find any merit in the complaint. There are no specific allegations of corruption against the public servant. The redressal of the grievance of the complainant does not lie in the domain of the Lokpal of India.

Hence, no order needs to be passed in the matter. Accordingly, the complaint stands disposed of.
