ORDER

Perused the complaint.

- 2. This complaint is not directed against any specific public servant(s) but is against "Banks and Government". No specific letter of complaint has been sent to the Lokpal but reference is made to the Chairperson of the Lokpal of India, in a letter jointly addressed to the Hon'ble President of India, the Hon'ble Chief Justice of India and the Hon'ble Chairperson of the NHRC.
- 3. The grievance of the complainant is of a general and sweeping nature, in as much as he appears to be concerned regarding the Government schemes that are affiliated with Banks, which, according to him, are not being implemented properly. This, in his opinion, is leading to committing of suicides by farmers.

- 4. The complainant alleges that the Government, itself, is 'cheating' the farmers, which facts remain undisclosed. He states that the factual position would emerge only after a Commission is appointed to inquire into the implementation of Government schemes linked to Banks. The complainant further adds that he will provide the evidence, personally.
- 5. Having perused the complaint, the Lokpal of India finds that it is vague and general in nature, naming no public servant and covering a sweeping range of policy matters and their implementation, without providing any details. Moreover, no element of corruption has been mentioned.
- 6. For the above reasons, we find that the subject-matter of the complaint does not attract the provisions of the Lokpal and Lokayuktas Act, 2013, therefore, we are not inclined to pass further orders.
- 7. Accordingly, the complaint stands disposed of.
