ORDER

Perused the complaint.

- 2. The complainant had filed this complaint on 20th February, 2021. Upon scrutiny of the same, it was noticed that there were some deficiencies. The Secretariat of the Lokpal of India, on 25th June, 2021, wrote to the complainant to remove the deficiencies. However, till date the complainant has not removed these deficiencies. Despite this, in the interest of justice, it was decided to consider this complaint and take a decision thereupon on the merits of the case.
- 3. The complainant has complained against the Hon'ble Chief Minister, Uttar Pradesh and Chief, Ghaziabad Development Authority (GDA). The complainant has not mentioned the exact details of the allegation against the individuals. However, from the papers attached to the complaint, it appears that the complainant or his family members had applied and paid for two plots in Indirapuram in 1989. In 2010, the complainant wrote a

letter to the Vice-Chairman, GDA wanting the plots or his money back immediately. There is also a reply from GDA to an RTI filed by him saying that his request for information is not clear.

- 4. The Full Bench has perused the complaint and the documents attached to the complaint. As the subject matter of the complaint relates to the affairs of the State Government, the Full Bench is of the view that the complaint is not covered by the mandate provided to the Lokpal under the Lokpal and Lokayuktas Act, 2013. Therefore, no order needs to be passed in this case. However as there is some evidence in the form of Bank challans of deposits made by the complainant in Oriental Bank of Commerce, in the year 1989, we are of the opinion that the grievance of the complainant, who is a senior citizen, needs to be looked into by appropriate authorities. We, therefore, refer the complaint to Hon'ble Lokayukta, Uttar Pradesh for necessary action at their end. The complainant is at liberty to approach the appropriate authorities for the redressal of his grievances.
- 5. Accordingly, the complaint is disposed of.
