ORDER

The complaint is placed before the Full Bench for consideration of the Scrutiny

Report and to pass appropriate order.

2. Perused the Scrutiny Report and gone through the records.

- 3. The complaint is against MLA, Bharthana, Etawah, Uttar Pradesh. The complainant has stated in his complaint that his agricultural land has been illegally encroached by the MLA, Bharthana, Etawah, Uttar Pradesh on 18.10.2023. The complainant has stated that he, along with his brothers are bhumidhars of Survey No.94A, 94/2/2, 94/2/1. The complainant has further stated that he had made complaints against the aforesaid illegal encroachment to the concerned administration, Chief Minister's portal and Prime Minister's portal. However, despite 23 letters filed as grievances, no action has been taken against the illegal encroachment and false reports have been filed due to the clout of the aforesaid MLA. The complainant has further stated that no official from the Tehsil has made a spot inspection and that only once the local Lekhpal had visited the site and returned after ten minutes.
- 4. From perusal of the complaint, it is seen that the complainant has attached a list of complaint numbers of the complaints filed by him. However, copies of such complaints could not be found enclosed with the instant complaint. The complainant has further alleged that the Tehsildar and other concerned officials have never visited the disputed land and instead they have submitted false/forged reports to administration.
- 5. The allegation in the complaint is against a public servant of the State of Uttar Pradesh and not against a public servant working in connection with the affairs of the Union, falling under Section 14(1) of the Lokpal and Lokayuktas Act, 2013. As such, the Lokpal of India has no jurisdiction to entertain this complaint. Moreover, there is no specific allegation of corruption in the complaint.

6. Accordingly, the complaint stands disposed of, granting liberty to the complainant to approach the appropriate forum, if he so desires.
